Smith Nomination—Agreement: Senate resumed consideration of the nomination of M. Patricia Smith, of New York, to be Solicitor for the Department of Labor. **Pages S366–89**

During consideration of this measure today, Senate took the following action:

By 60 yeas to 32 nays (Vote No. 17), three-fifths of those Senators duly chosen and sworn, having voted in the affirmative, Senate agreed to the motion to close further debate on the nomination. **Page S386**

A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing for further consideration of the nomination post-cloture at approximately 11 a.m., on Tuesday, February 2, 2010; that the time during any adjournment, recess, or period of morning business count post-cloture. **Page S398**
