Measures Passed:

Small Business Penalty Fairness Act: Committee on Finance was discharged from further consideration of S. 2917, to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to modify the penalty for failure to disclose certain reportable transactions and the penalty for submitting a bad check to the Internal Revenue Service, to modify certain rules relating to Federal vendors, and the bill was then passed. **Pages S541–42**

Death of Representative John P. Murtha: Senate agreed to S. Res. 413, relative to the death of Representative John P. Murtha, of Pennsylvania. **Page S542**

Nominations Confirmed: Senate confirmed the following nominations:

By unanimous vote of 84 yeas (Vote No. EX. 21), Joseph A. Greenaway, Jr., of New Jersey, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Third Circuit. **Pages S510–28, S543**

Clifford L. Stanley, of Pennsylvania, to be Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness.

Becker Nomination: Senate resumed consideration of the nomination Craig Becker, of Illinois, to be a Member of the National Labor Relations Board. **Pages S510–28**
