Restoring American Financial Stability Act—Agreement: Senate resumed consideration of S. 3217, to promote the financial stability of the United States by improving accountability and transparency in the financial system, to end “too big to fail”, to protect the American taxpayer by ending bailouts, to protect consumers from abusive financial services practices, taking action on the following amendments proposed thereto: **Pages S3457–70**

Reid (for Dodd/Lincoln) Amendment No. 3739, in the nature of a substitute. **Page S3457**

Sanders/Dodd Modified Amendment No. 3738 (to Amendment No. 3739), to require the non-partisan Government Accountability Office to conduct an independent audit of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System that does not interfere with monetary policy, to let the American people know the names of the recipients of over \$2,000,000,000,000 in taxpayer assistance from the Federal Reserve System. **Page S3457**

A unanimous-consent-time agreement was reached providing for further consideration of the bill on Tuesday, May 11, 2010, after any Leader time, and debate concurrently Sanders/Dodd Modified Amendment No. 3738 (to Amendment No. 3739) (listed above), and Vitter Amendment No. 3760; that prior

to a vote on or in relation to each amendment, there be a total debate limit of 80 minutes, with 20 minutes each under the control of Senators Sanders, Vitter, Shelby and Dodd, or their designees; that upon the use or yielding back of all time, the Senate vote on or in relation to Sanders/Dodd Modified Amendment No. 3738 (to Amendment No. 3739), followed by a vote on or in relation to the Vitter amendment, with no amendment in order to either amendment. **Page S3470**

Burmese Freedom and Democracy Act—Referral Agreement: A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that the Committee on Foreign Relations be discharged from further consideration of S.J. Res. 29, approving the renewal of import restrictions contained in the Burmese Freedom and Democracy Act of 2003, and the bill then be referred to the Committee on Finance. **Page S3485**
