## House of Representatives

### Chamber Action

**Public Bills and Resolutions Introduced:** 25 public bills, H.R. 6082–6106; and 3 resolutions, H. Res. 1607–1609 were introduced. **Pages H6626–27**

**Recess:** The House recessed at 9:24 a.m. and reconvened at 10 a.m. **Page H6582**

**Suspensions:** The House agreed to suspend the rules and pass the following measure:

*Making emergency supplemental appropriations for border security:* H.R. 6080, making emergency supplemental appropriations for border security for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010. **Pages H6584–89**

**Question of Privilege:** The Chair ruled that the resolution offered by Representative Price (GA) did not constitute a question of the privileges of the House. Subsequently, Representative Price (GA) appealed the ruling of the chair and Representative Polis moved to table the appeal. Agreed to the motion to table the appeal of the ruling of the Chair by a yeas-and-nays vote of 236 yeas to 163 nays, Roll No. 515. **Pages H6597–99**

**FAA Air Transportation Modernization and Safety Improvement Act:** The House concurred in the Senate amendment to the House amendment to the Senate amendment to H.R. 1586, to modernize the air traffic control system, improve the safety, reliability, and availability of transportation by air in the United States, provide for modernization of the air traffic control system, reauthorize the Federal Aviation Administration, by a yeas-and-nays vote of 247 yeas to 161 nays, Roll No. 518. **Pages H6603–25**

H. Res. 1606, the rule providing for consideration of the Senate amendment, was agreed to by a yeas-and-nays vote of 229 yeas to 173 nays, Roll No. 517, after the previous question was ordered by a yeas-and-nays vote of 244 yeas to 164 nays, Roll No. 516. **Pages H6603, H6604**
