NEW PUBLIC LAWS

H.R. 4684, to require the Secretary of the Treasury to strike medals in commemoration of the 10th anniversary of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks on the United States and the establishment of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum at the World Trade Center. Signed on August 6, 2010. (Public Law 111–221)

S. 1053, to amend the National Law Enforcement Museum Act to extend the termination date. Signed on August 6, 2010. (Public Law 111–222)

H.R. 2765, to amend title 28, United States Code, to prohibit recognition and enforcement of foreign defamation judgments and certain foreign judgments against the providers of interactive com-

puter services. Signed on August 10, 2010. (Public Law 111–223)

H.R. 5874, making supplemental appropriations for the United States Patent and Trademark Office for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010, and for other purposes. Signed on August 10, 2010. (Public Law 111–224)

S. 1749, to amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit the possession or use of cell phones and similar wireless devices by Federal prisoners. Signed on August 10, 2010. (Public Law 111–225)

H.R. 1586, to modernize the air traffic control system, improve the safety, reliability, and availability of transportation by air in the United States, provide for modernization of the air traffic control system, reauthorize the Federal Aviation Administration, and for other purposes. Signed on August 10, 2010. (Public Law 111–226)
