S. 3454, to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2013 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government and the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System. Signed on January 14, 2013. (Public Law 112–277)

S. 3472, to amend the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 to provide improvements to such Act. Signed on January 14, 2013. (Public Law 112–278)

S. 3630, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 218 North Milwaukee Street in Waterford, Wisconsin, as the “Captain Rhett W. Schiller Post Office”. Signed on January 14, 2013. (Public Law 112–279)

S. 3662, to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 6 Nichols Street in Westminister, Massachusetts, as the “Lieutenant Ryan Patrick Jones Post Office Building”. Signed on January 14, 2013. (Public Law 112–280)

S. 3677, to make a technical correction to the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973. Signed on January 14, 2013. (Public Law 112–281)

S. J. Res. 44, granting the consent of Congress to the State and Province Emergency Management Assistance Memorandum of Understanding. Signed on January 14, 2013. (Public Law 112–282)

S. 2318, to authorize the Secretary of State to pay a reward to combat transnational organized crime and for information concerning foreign nationals wanted by international criminal tribunal. Signed on January 15, 2013. (Public Law 112–283)
