H.R. 1911, to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to establish interest rates for new loans made on or after July 1, 2013, with an amendment (H. Rept. 113–82, Pt. 1);

H.R. 1949, to direct the Secretary of Education to convene the Advisory Committee on Improving Postsecondary Education Data to conduct a study on improvements to postsecondary education transparency at the Federal level, with an amendment (H. Rept. 113–83);

H.R. 258, to amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to fraudulent representations about having received military declarations or medals (H. Rept. 113–84);

H.R. 1073, to amend title 18, United States Code, to provide for protection of maritime navigation and prevention of nuclear terrorism, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 113–85);

H.R. 271, to clarify that compliance with an emergency order under section 202(c) of the Federal Power Act may not be considered a violation of any Federal, State, or local environmental law or regulation, and for other purposes (H. Rept. 113–86); and
