Measures Passed:

National Aphasia Awareness Month: Senate agreed to S. Res. 168, designating June 2013 as “National Aphasia Awareness Month” and supporting efforts to increase awareness of aphasia. **Page S4432**

Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act Papers Returned—Agreement: A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that the Committee on Appropriations be discharged from further consideration of H.R. 2217, making appropriations for the Department of Homeland Security for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014;

that the papers with respect to the bill be returned to the House of Representatives, as requested by the House; that when the bill is received back in the Senate, it be referred to the Committee on Appropriations with no intervening action or debate. **Page S4432**
