### Chamber Action

*Routine Proceedings, pages S4849–S4986*

**Measures Introduced:** Two resolutions were introduced, as follows: S. Res. 181–182. **Page S4983**

#### Measures Passed:

*Sesquicentennial of West Virginia:* Senate agreed to S. Res. 181, recognizing the sesquicentennial of West Virginia and commemorating its history, people, and culture. **Page S4985**

*American Dental Hygienists' Association 100th Anniversary:* Senate agreed to S. Res. 182, congratulating the American Dental Hygienists' Association on the 100th anniversary of the profession of dental hygiene and commending its work to improve the oral health of the people of the United States. **Page S4985**

#### Measures Considered:

**Border Security, Economic Opportunity, and Immigration Modernization Act—Agreement:** Senate continued consideration of S. 744, to provide for comprehensive immigration reform, taking action on the following amendments and motions proposed thereto: **Pages S4850–S4981**

Pending:

Leahy Modified Amendment No. 1183, to strengthen border security and enforcement. **Pages S4850, S4860–S4976**

Boxer/Landrieu Amendment No. 1240, to require training for National Guard and Coast Guard officers and agents in training programs on border protection, immigration law enforcement, and how to address vulnerable populations, such as children and victims of crime. **Page S4850**

Cruz Amendment No. 1320, to replace title I of the bill with specific border security requirements, which shall be met before the Secretary of Homeland Security may process applications for registered immigrant status or blue card status and to avoid Department of Homeland Security budget reductions. **Page S4850**

Leahy (for Reed) Amendment No. 1224, to clarify the physical present requirements for merit-based immigrant visa applicants. **Page S4850**

Reid Amendment No. 1551 (to Modified Amendment No. 1183), to change the enactment date. **Page S4976**

A motion was entered to close further debate on the Leahy Modified Amendment No. 1183 (listed above), and, in accordance with the provisions of Rule XXII of the Standing Rules of the Senate, and pursuant to the unanimous-consent agreement of Friday, June 21, 2013, a vote on cloture will occur at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 24, 2013. **Page S4976**

Reid Amendment No. 1552 (to the language proposed to be stricken by the reported committee substitute amendment to the bill), to change the enactment date. **Page S4977**

Reid Amendment No. 1553 (to Amendment No. 1552), of a perfecting nature. **Page S4977**

**Foxx Nomination—Agreement:** A unanimous-consent-time agreement was reached providing that at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, in consultation with the Republican Leader, Senate begin consideration of the nomination of Anthony Renard Foxx, of North Carolina, to be Secretary of Transportation; that there be 30 minutes for debate, equally divided in the usual form; that following the use or yielding back of time, Senate vote, without

intervening action or debate, on confirmation of the nomination; that no further motions be in order.

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**Pritzker Nomination—Agreement:** A unanimous-consent-time agreement was reached providing that at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, in consultation with the Republican Leader, Senate begin consideration of the nomination of Penny Pritzker, of Illinois, to be Secretary of Commerce; that there be 30 minutes for debate, equally divided in the usual form; that following the use or yielding back of time, Senate vote, without intervening action or debate, on confirmation of the nomination; that no further motions be in order.

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**Nominations Received:** Senate received the following nominations:

James B. Comey, Jr., of Connecticut, to be Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a term of ten years.

James C. Miller III, of Virginia, to be a Governor of the United States Postal Service for the term expiring December 8, 2017.

Anne J. Udall, of Oregon, to be a Member of the Board of Trustees of the Morris K. Udall and Stewart L. Udall Foundation for a term expiring October 6, 2016.
