S. 136, to amend chapter 21 of title 5, United States Code, to provide that fathers of certain permanently disabled or deceased veterans shall be included with mothers of such veterans as preference eligibles for treatment in the civil service (H. Rept. 114–263);

H.R. 3089, to close out expired grants, and for other purposes, with an amendment (H. Rept. 114–264); and

H.R. 692, to ensure the payment of interest and principal of the debt of the United States (H. Rept. 114–265). **Page H6177**

Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act: The House passed H.R. 3504, to amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit a health care practitioner from failing to exercise the proper degree of care in the case of a child who survives an abortion or attempted abortion, by a yea-and-nay vote of 248 yeas to 177 nays with one answering “present”, Roll No. 506. **Pages H6143–52, H6167**

H. Res. 421, the rule providing for consideration of the bills (H.R. 3134) to provide for a moratorium

on Federal funding to Planned Parenthood Federation of America, Inc. and (H.R. 3504) to amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit a health care practitioner from failing to exercise the proper degree of care in the case of a child who survives an abortion or attempted abortion, was agreed to yesterday, September 17th.

Defund Planned Parenthood Act of 2015: The House passed H.R. 3134, to provide for a moratorium on Federal funding to Planned Parenthood Federation of America, Inc., by a recorded vote of 241 yeas to 187 noes with one answering “present”, Roll No. 505. **Pages H6152–67**

Reject the Esty motion to recommit the bill the bill to the Committee on Energy and Commerce with instructions to report the same back to the House forthwith with an amendment, by a yea-and-nay vote of 183 yeas to 245 nays, Roll No. 504.
